## REQUIREMENTS FOR COMPLETION OF CLUB PERMIT LOG BOOKS

Thank you for your letter dated 6 October 2012 addressed to **Mr** Mario Cattapan seeking VicRoads' advice regarding requirements for drivers operating unregistered vehicles (including "street rods") on club permits, to complete log book details. **Mr** Cattapan has asked that I respond to your queries directly.

I note that regulation 157(2) of the Road Safety (Vehicles) Regulations 2009 states that "On each day that a vehicle operated under a club permit will be driven outside the vehicle's local zone, the driver must fully complete the next available entry in the log book before beginning the journey". A copy of the regulation in its entirety is attached.

**In** regard to your questions, I advise:

- o VicRoads' view is that the log book's "Particulars of Use" column should list the vehicle's intended ultimate destination for the day's use (excluding the return 'trip'). **It** is recognised that on occasion, the vehicle may not reach the intended destination or the destination may change. **If** this occurs, the original destination should be struck out and a new destination written in the same row.
- o The above regulation clearly specifies that the driver must complete the log book entry. **In** this regard it should be noted that only the **FIRST** entry for the day must be recorded. Subsequent uses of the vehicle on that day, or subsequent drivers of the vehicle on that day are not required to be recorded.
- VicRoads has not previously provided a direction about the use of the driver's name, however, to ensure that the identity of the driver is entirely clear; the driver should enter their name as it appears on their drivers licence.
- o Future printing of the log book will include the above information. I will also ensure that the above information is placed on VicRoads' website and brought to the attention of the Federation of Veteran Vintage Classic and Historic Car Clubs and the Association of Motoring Clubs.
